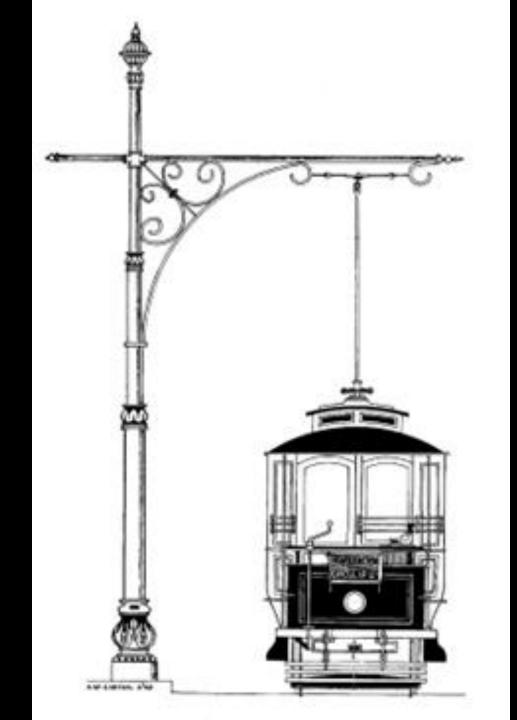

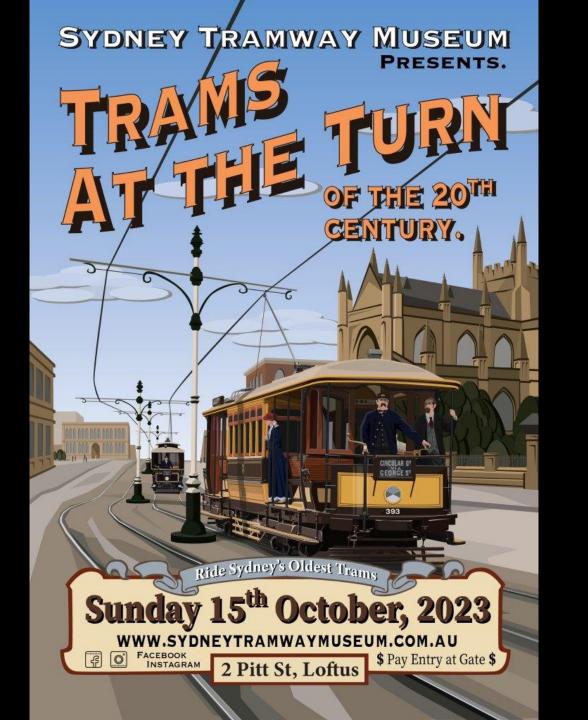

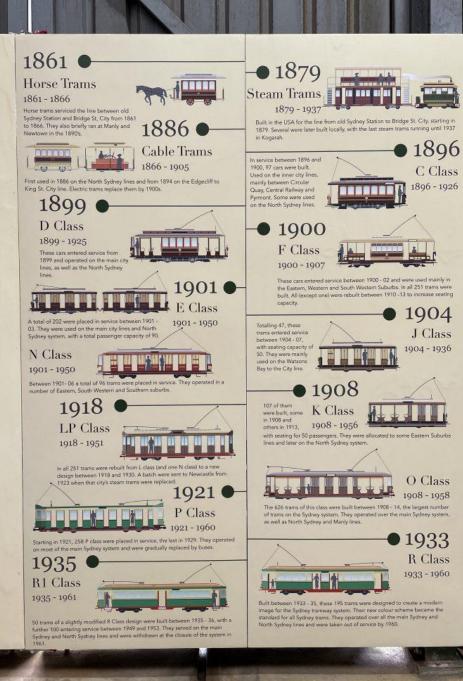




















The Manly line opened on 14th February 1903 with steam trams operating between Manly Wharf and Curl Curl. The system continually extended north with the final extension in 1925 from North Manly to Harbord Beach.

It was initially steam operated but was replaced by horse trams due to low passenger numbers between 1903 1907. Steam operation commenced again for a second time in the summer of 1907. This was short lived as in 1911 the line was electrified and steam trams were replaced by electric trams.

The Manly system was mostly isolated from the rest of the Sydney system by Middle Harbour. A tramcar punt was introduced in 1912 which would transfer rollingstock between Manly Wharf to the Spit which was part of the North Sydney system.

The Manly system was closed in September 1939 and was replaced by hijs services.
